
Catch the Ace: Lion Ron Graham is organizing our latest fundraiser. Lion Ron picked up the lottery license (September 6) at City Hall. Lion Doug will make a cabinet for the cards. The lottery will run for 32 weeks. Three or four teams are needed to run it. An easel will be needed to display the envelopes. Lion Ron has a contact with a radio station so there will be P.S.A.'s. He is lining up two video people. People are needed to pick up the tickets and money. Proceeds go to general welfare. The first draw is planned for October 4. We need the help of all LCLC Lions to help run the lottery and promote it as much as possible—especially in its early stages.
