## **Lions Memorial at the Klopp Ausable Conservation Area**



To remember past Lions and Lioness, this sign is located on Hwy. 84 Hensall at the Klopp Commemorative Woods which is part of some 5000 acres originally owned by the family of Lion Wilf Klopp. The property was donated to the Ausable -Bayfield Conservation Authority, which named the location commemorating the contribution of the Klopp family. Locally, an area memorial garden has been established as part of the property and the Lions Memorial Sign was installed on Aug. 23, 2002 by Lions Wilf Klopp, Henry Feenstra, Stu Rayner and Dave Williams.

On Sunday, August 18, 2013, under a sunny, nearly cloudless sky, London Central Lions Club held its annual dedication of commemorative plaques at the Lions Memorial Garden.

It is particularly bittersweet to note that the memorial site, which honours Lions who have passed, exists due to the generosity of a LCLC member we lost this year, Lion Wilf Klopp. Wilf's numerous contributions and those of Lambeth Lion members Adriaan Van Dongen and Wayne Parker, were commemorated in this year's dedication.

Twelve LCLC members, five Lambeth Lions Club members and several relatives of those Lions honoured heard the Reverend Frank Mantz (Lutheran) speak with deep appreciation of the volunteerism shown by Wilf, Adrian and Wayne, and provide encouragement to Lions to continue their good work.

It was truly a heartfelt tribute to three Lions who during their time as Lions, contributed over 103 years of service. Reverend Mantz pointed out that in total, those Lions who have been commemorated at the Lions Memorial in the past had contributed over 544 years of service to their communities as members of their Lions Clubs.

These Lion members will be fondly remembered by other Lion members who continue to uphold our motto "WE SERVE". Thanks to Lion Catherine Dallas for her report on the August 18th service.
